Introduction



All the work done by the **NHS** to manage **coronavirus** has led to:



- **health and care services** working together for the first time



- **work** being done quicker than normal



- **health and care services** coming up with **new ideas** together.

NHS England and NHS Improvement paid for a project to look into this.



The project was carried out by speaking to:



- people with a **lived experience** of using health and care services



Lived experience is the things that someone goes through in their life.




- **80** different **organisations** with an interest in health and wellbeing.



The project looked at:

- how things had **changed**



- if the changes made services **better**.



- if the changes could lead to **better health and care services** in the future.

Researchers looked at ways that **health and care services:**



- came up with **new ideas** for running **health and care services**




- carried out **medical research**

- worked together.



The project looked at things that had worked well during **coronavirus**, such as:



- managing **health and care services** in different ways



- using **computers**



- having useful **information**.



And how this could support people, **NHS** workers and **health and care services** in the future.



The project also looked at the **differences in health** between different **ethnic groups** and **other groups**.



There were **5 Parts** to the project.

This part of the project looked at:



- the best ways to work and how all **NHS** health and care services could use these **ideas**



- the **differences in health** between different groups



- what went well and what did not go well.

A quick review



This part of the project looked at the best ways to find out if the changes to **health and care services** had worked.




Part 3

- **interviewed** experts
- found out what **other countries** were doing
- looked at good work being done **around the world**.



And if this **work** could be done in the **UK** too.



Part 4

Working with people and health and care services

This part of the **project** included:



- **3 workshops** for experts



- **a big meeting** to look at this project



Everyone **agreed** what had been found during the project and what should happen next.

200

Some reports were written about what should happen next.




In the **reports** it said:



- the project was done **quickly**





- the project was carried out when **new information** was coming out **every day**

What the project found



There were **6** important things that were found out during the project.




1. Working together



When **health and care services** work together they know from each other what to do.



2. Good leadership



Services can get better more quickly when leaders:



- support **new ideas**

NHS



- make it easier for health and care services to **work together.**



3. Making sure everyone is included



So that there are **less differences in health** between different groups, it is important to:



- get ideas from lots of different people



- have more services that support the different needs of different groups.



4. Making changes by using everyone's skills



It is easier to change **health and care services** when **NHS** workers:



- have the **skills** to find new ways to sort out problems



- can start working in **new ways.**




5. Using information and computers



It is easier to make quick changes to **health and care services**:

- when you can share **information**
- when health and care services have **computer systems** that work well.





6. Making the best decisions



To make a good decision it is important to understand:

- **what** works well



- **who** it works well for



- **when** it works best.



At the **workshops** and the **big meeting** they talked about:

- the **6 important things** that were found out during the project



- how **health and care services** need to change.



What happens next?



A lot of people and health and care services talked about the project at the **workshops** and the **big meeting**.

The 12 Suggestions



Suggestion 1 Have more co-production




Co-production is when health and care services work together on new projects with **people with a lived experience**.



Health and care services should have more **co-production** projects so that they:



- learn more about **health and care services**



- change **health and care services** to make them better.



Suggestion 2

Make health and care services fairer for everyone

Health and care services can be fair for everyone when we:



- find out how health and care services can make the **differences in health** between different groups smaller



- find out how **health and care services** can change so that they meet the support needs of everyone



- make sure that lots of different groups take part in projects about **coronavirus**.



Suggestion 3

Have more leaders who support new ideas



There should be **more leaders**:

- who support **new ideas**
- who make changes that are good for **everyone**



- who run **health and care services** that can **change quickly**



- who tell the **truth**



- who are honest when **health and care services** are not good.





Suggestion 4

Have more workplaces that support good ideas



There needs to be:

- more health and care services that want to listen to **new ideas**



- more health and care services where services can **change quickly**



- more health and care services that work closely with **local councils** and **charities** to meet local needs.



Suggestion 5

Run more health services using computers



Work with health and care services so that patients can choose:

- a **face-to-face service**
- a service using a **computer**.



Suggestion 6 Information and support for everyone



More **information** should be made by working with:

- **people with lived experience**



- people who have **good ideas**



- **health and care workers.**



This will make sure that lots of different groups use **new types of care services.**



Suggestion 7 Share information



When you work together with **different health and care services** it makes it easier to understand how:



- **information** can be shared while keeping private information safe



- **information** can be collected so that better decisions are made.



Suggestion 8

Carry out more projects with different groups



Projects on **health and care services** are better when:



- working with groups that **do not** take part in projects such as people with a learning disability and autistic people



- it is **easy** for different groups to take part in **projects**



- the results of the projects are shared with the public and **NHS** workers.



Suggestion 9

Work with more health and care services across the world



Find out if UK health and care services could take part in more **medical research** with health and care services around the world.



Suggestion 10

Carry out more projects using computers



Find out how:

- **computers** could be used to support everyone to work more closely together



- **computers** could be used to carry out projects.



Suggestion 11

Important work for health and care services



Make sure **new health and care services:**



- can find out what is most important in their local area



- tell **regional organisations** and **national organisations** what they are going to do first.



A **regional organisation** looks after health and care services in different parts of the country such as the **West Midlands** or **South East**.



A **national organisation** looks after health and care services across the country.



Suggestion 12


Look into the differences in health between different groups



When different people and health and care services work together:




- they can find out the best ways to change **health and care services** so that they are fair for everyone
